Stichting ARTICLE 19 monitored the state of freedom of expression across the region and conducted sustained campaigning and advocacy to European institutions and global human rights mechanisms, working with national partners in our priority countries and international coalitions of human rights defenders and experts, aiming at empowering individuals and marginalised groups to speak out and be heard and to protect press freedom.
